Defended a leading medical device manufacturer in a patent infringement litigation concerning a hip fracture repair system (D. Del.). The Court granted our client's fully dispositive motion for summary judgment of invalidity for lack of enablement, finding all claims invalid, and cancelled the upcoming trial.
